

Cedar Oil Solution



Instructions For 20% Solution

The 20% solution cedar oil spray comes in a 32 oz spray bottle. Thus it will be half full when you get it. Take off the tape and you can use it immediately for the highest concentration of cedar. Use sparingly. It's not like insecticide. If you spray it on a bug it will not die immediately. It will take a few hours to die, but it will die. (Some bugs like silverfish die almost immediately. But roaches are very resilient. They will take a little bit of time to die, same for crickets. Basically they starve to death.) The main thing you are doing with the cedar oil is disrupting the senses of the insect and it will naturally go away from the cedar spray over time because bugs don't like to be disoriented. So the best places to start is where you see them and entry ways: Doors, windows, garages, sun rooms, etc. You are driving them out by making the area uncomfortable to the insects. Using the highest concentration is best for this. After you hit all the hot spots you can add water to take it to a 7-10% solution (depending how much of the 20% solution you use.) This is plenty to maintain the effect. But the important thing is not to waste it trying to drown the insect. Yes, it'll eventually work, but you are wasting your spray.
